Our Goal

Our goal is to deliver a peer-to-peer set of presentations, showcasing the best and brightest in the world of BIM – those who are pushing the boundaries, how they got there and what's next. In addition to these presentations, IMAGINiT experts will also showcase a variety of tools and techniques to assist users and organizations in reaching their own next level of performance.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Preferences will be given to those companies whose topics support the goal of the event. To be considered, you must have been using BIM for at least 1 year and be able to provide a high-level (non-technical) overview of your process, objectives and results. We are opening this opportunity up to IMAGINiT clients only at this time. Timeframe of your presentation should be roughly 30 minutes.

We will be accepting submissions until June 10. We'll make our selections no later than June 17, 2011 and notify all parties of the status of their submission on or before that date.

Areas of presentation to consider:

1. Model Planning

Whether it is called a Level of Design document, Revit Model Plan, or BIM Execution Plan the idea is the same: Increase confidence when interacting with shared project files and control hours overruns from modeling too much too soon. What approach did you take to meet these goals? What benefit have you realized?

2. Development and Use of BIM Standards

Consistency requires standardization, in the new BIM software environment what has your firm done to document and implement BIM standards across your organization? What benefit have you realized?

3. Strategies for Large Projects in Revit

Hardware limitations have long been the limiting factor in the size and complexity of projects that Revit can handle, yet very large and model intensive projects have been completed in Revit. What strategies have your firm developed to successfully complete large projects?

4. Case Study Examples of BIM Success

What has your firm done using BIM to drive benefit for multiple project stakeholders?

5. Civil Coordination and Collaboration

Are you interacting with civil models in a Revit or Navisworks environment? Are you using Autodesk QTO on a civil model? Do you include a civil file as part of your coordination model? What are you doing to manage and integrate civil data in your BIM?
